AAcme reserves the right to change or modify any of the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement, any Addendum and any policy or guideline incorporated by reference at any time and from time to time in its sole discretion, and to determine whether and when any such changes apply to both existing or future customers. Any changes or modification will be effective upon posting of the revisions on the AAcme Web site (the "Site"). Your continued use of Services following AAcme posting of any changes or modifications will constitute your acceptance of such changes or modifications.

#### 1. TERM AND PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

## 1.1. Term

This Agreement shall be for an "Initial Term" as chosen by you in the Order Form located on this Site at the time you register for the Services. This Agreement will be automatically renewed (the "Renewal Term") at the end of the Initial Term for the same period as the Initial Term unless you provide AAcme with notice of termination thirty (30) days prior to the end of the Initial Term or the Renewal Term.

## 1.2. Termination Policy

If you terminate your receipt of the Services prior to the end of the Initial Term or the Renewal Term, whichever is then applicable, (a) AAcme will not refund to you any fees paid in advance of such termination and (b) you shall be required to pay 100% of AAcme standard monthly charge for each month remaining in the term, unless otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement. ## 1.4. Charges

You agree to pay for all charges attributable to your use of the Services at the then current AAcme prices, which shall be exclusive of any applicable taxes. You are responsible for the payment of all federal, state, and local sales, use, value added, excise, duty and any other taxes assessed with respect to the Services, other than taxes based on AAcme's net income.

## 1.5. Payment

We undertake that this will not be done for commercial purposes or for our personal gain.
